Deputy Director, Aging and Disability Business Institute, National Association of Area Agencies on Aging

Topic: "Bridging the Gap Between Healthcare and Community Based Organizations"

Topic: "From Hospital to Home: Integrating Care from Acute to Community Settings"

Abigail Morgan joined Direction Home Akron Canton in 2013 and leads a dynamic team responsible for managing a network of 200+ service providers, as well as the Agency's planning functions. Mrs. Morgan collaborates across divisions to identify program needs and pursue new funding opportunities to support their strategic initiatives. She began her career as a case manager in the largest homeless shelter in Philadelphia. After graduate school, Mrs. Morgan worked with the National Aging Services Network. In the wake of the Medicare Modernization Act of 2003, she joined the staff of the National Association of Area Agencies on Aging (n4a) and worked with AAAs across the country developing enrollment strategies for Medicare beneficiaries in the new Medicare prescription drug benefit. While at n4a, Mrs. Morgan contributed to the national survey of AAAs and the development of n4a's business acumen for AAAs.

Ms. Moore-Hardy serves on the Ohio Hospital Association Institute for Health Innovation Board and was the 2016 Chair of the Ohio Hospital Association Board. She also serves on the boards of the Greater Cleveland Food Bank, the Cleveland Chapter of the Alzheimer's Association, Holden Arboretum and Ursuline College.

Courtney Reynolds, MA, MSSA, LSW, Research Analyst, Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging

Courtney Reynolds, M.A., M.S.S.A., LSW, is a Research Analyst at the Benjamin Rose Institute on Aging and a licensed social worker. Her professional and research interests include elder abuse and aging in place. She is currently working with Dr. Farida Ejaz as the Project Coordinator on two Elder Justice projects funded by the U.S. Administration for Community Living. The first project is testing an intensive case management intervention to prevent self-neglect in atrisk adults who are primary care healthcare patients in Texas. The second project is an evaluation of an enhanced self-neglect practice based on the Texas intervention that will be used by Oklahoma Adult Protective Services with clients who have an allegation of self-neglect; this involves long-term follow-up to prevent it from reoccurring.
